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L'École d'été InGRID-2

L'École d'été de InGRID 2 a eu lieu du 4 au 9 juin 2018 au CEET (Noisy-le-Grand) sur le thème "Advanced measurement of quality of working life".

The summer school aims at training doctoral students or early-career researchers. It is also opened to academics, policy practitioners and other interested users, providing participants with opportunities to discuss their projects and to network with leading international experts and other colleagues in the field.

The summer school will take place near Paris at Noisy-Le Grand, at the Centre of Employment and Work Studies (CEET). The CEET will provide and organise logistics for the week (practical information will be given soon).

InGRID-2 events

InGRID creates opportunities for networking, dialogue and knowledge exchange through five types of events. The partners are organising **summer schools** for early-stage researchers, **expert workshops** for senior researchers and other experts, **special interest groups** for a specific community within the InGRID community-of-interest, **data forums** to reach out to data providers and research users, and **stakeholder platform conferences**. Calls for these events are frequently launched on the project website and announced in the InGRID newflashes. Candidates can apply via the website. Accepted participants can receive travel and subsistence reimbursement. Participation to some events can be on invitation only.

EUROMOD-HHoT summer school 'Using EUROMOD for model family simulations'

Organised by CSB - University of Antwerp, Antwerp (Belgium) from 13 June to 15 June 2018

This summer school combined the EUROMOD training course with an introduction to the Hypothetical Household Tool, called HHoT. HHoT is a state-of-the-art tax-benefit tool for researchers who want to use model family calculations in a European comparative setting. It is an EUROMOD plug-in that has been developed jointly by the Institute for Social and Economic Research (ISER) and the Centre for Social Policy (CSB) in the framework of the InGRID project. During the summer school, nineteen participants were taught how to use EUROMOD and HHoT by researchers from the CSB. The course included a variety of lectures, live demonstrations and hands-on exercise sessions to familiarise participants with EUROMOD and HHoT.

Summer school 'Advanced measurement of quality of working life'

Organised by Cnam-CEET, Noisy Le Grand (France) from 4 June to 8 June 2018

We welcomed twenty young researchers in sociology, economics, and statistics, coming from Albania, France, Germany, Italy, Hungary, the Netherlands, Poland, Romania, Serbia, Sweden, Switzerland and Ukraine.

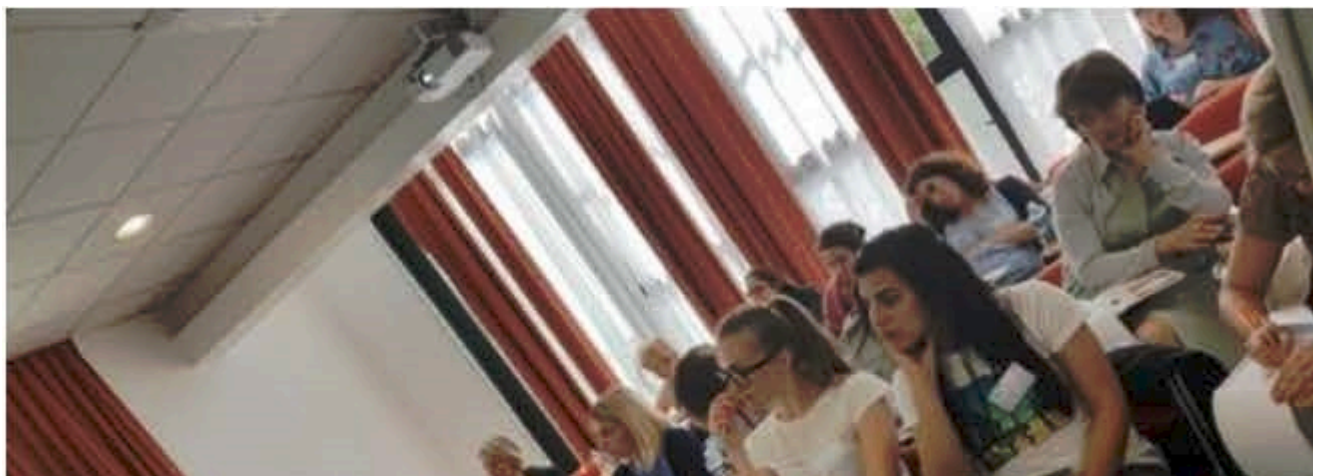


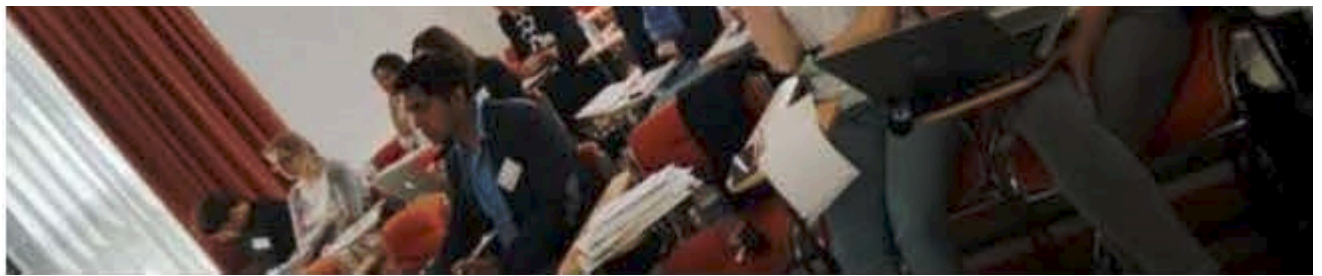
Sixteen speakers from different academic fields (economics, sociology, epidemiology, ergonomics, ...) succeeded one another throughout the week in five sessions. Christine Erhel, director of Cnam-CEET, opened the summer school. In the first session 'Conceptual framework and theoretical issues' Francis Green (University of Warwick) presented and discussed the various theoretical frameworks about quality of working life. In a next session, Ine Smits (HIVA-KU Leuven) and Sylvie Hamon-Cholet (Cnam-CEET) have shown which kinds of databases allow to measure quality of working life with a wide inventory of databases covering quality of working life and a French example, the French Working Conditions Survey. Elena Cottini (Catholic University of Milan), Yves Roquelaure (INSERM) and Mounia N. Hocine (Cnam-MESuRS) intervened on different main approaches of quality of working life as risk factors of adverse working life.

During Session 4, we explored a quite recent studied field, meaning skills utilisation as a dimension of quality of working life, with Chris Warhust (University of Warwick), Marie-Christine Fregin (Maastricht University) and Jasper van Loo (CEDEFOP). Session 5 was focused on an empirical approach with examples of advanced indicators of quality of working life, presented
